# Farewell to Jennie M. Forehand

The staff of Reach were saddened to hear of the passing of Jennie M. Foreman, former Maryland State Senator and long-term supporter. Forehand represented District 17, including parts of Rockville and Gaithersburg, from 1978-2015, first in the House of Delegates and later in the State Senate.

Passionate about health issues, Forehand was instrumental in securing funding for the creation of the Mansfield Kaseman Health Clinic. Planning for the Clinic took place during an

economic recession, meaning that the City of Rockville and County turned down requests for funding.

Forehand made it possible for the Clinic planning committee, including Rev. Mansfield Kaseman and other highly-respected community leaders, to present their case in Annapolis and obtain State funding, after which the County and other donors contributed as well.

Her legacy also includes advocating for the creation of the Rockville Senior Center, Rockville Library, and Shady Grove Adventist Hospital. We know she will be missed by the community.

# **REAP Swings Into Action**

Ms. M & Ms. R came to REAP in immediate danger of eviction. Ms. R had recently been laid off for the second time as her employer downsized due to lost revenue from the COVID-19 pandemic. She and her partner were struggling to keep up with their monthly expenses and owed several months of back rent and utility payments. They received a court notice and had a limited amount of time to find the money needed to stay in their home with the lights on. To make matters worse, the couple were caring for a child with medical issues. They needed support to get themselves back on their feet and REAP was



there to help.

REAP swung into action, providing rental assistance to prevent eviction. Without the looming threat of losing their home, the family had the time and energy to work with our REAP Director to apply for other County benefits, like SNAP benefits, energy assistance, and child support, and to look for employment.

For hardworking families like this one, access to safety-net services like emergency financial assistance makes all the difference as they overcome obstacles on the path to self-sufficiency. Ms. M and Ms. R recently reported that one of them started a new full-time job, and their income covers their monthly expenses. They are very appreciative of the

assistance and case management they received.


