# About the Clinic

In May 2004, Community Ministries of Rockville (now Community Reach of Montgomery County) founded the Mansfield Kaseman Health Program (MKHP) in response to the need for increasing access to primary healthcare services for uninsured and underinsured adults in Greater Rockville. Initially, MKHP offered four hours of clinical service at one location in the community through services provided by Mobile Medical Car, Inc. and additional "wrap-around" services of counseling, training, education, and patient services provided by our own staff.

Over the next four years, we expanded clinic service hours, offering 12 hours of service per week at two Rockville locations: Crusader Lutheran Church and Lincoln Community Center. These two centers had a patient roll of approximately 500 and provided 1,300 patient visits per year. Almost thirty percent of the patients lived within the boundaries of the City of Rockville.

After conducting a feasibility study in 2007 that validated the need, we began the process of developing a permanent clinic for the uninsured. In 2009, we obtained a \$250,000 matching grant through the State of Maryland Bond Bill to support clinic construction and build-out. With critical support and a \$250,000 grant from Montgomery County through the Primary Care Coalition, we opened the Mansfield Kaseman Health Clinic (MKHC) at its current location in 2010.

Now, thirteen years later, we anxiously await the relocation of MKHC to 9420 Key West Avenue, Rockville in the spring of 2024. This highly anticipated move will grant MKHC an opportunity to expand its footprint in the County and connect with major healthcare providers like Adventist Healthcare Shady Grove Medical Center. It will be the start of a new era of transformation – a renaissance.








# **Auction Terms and Conditions GENERAL**

- 1. All bids are final. Before making a bid, please note any restrictions and specifications carefully. Unless otherwise specified, dates and times of services or the use of facilities are to be arranged mutually by the donor and buyer.
- 2. Unless otherwise specified, the use of auction items involving services or facilities must be completed by November 4, 2024.
- 3. All auction items are sold "as is."
- 4. Values indicated for auction items are good faith estimates of the value of the items furnished. We are required to provide these by the Internal Revenue Service. Any amount paid for the goods or services in excess of this estimate may be considered a charitable contribution. Where it is not possible to establish an independent value for one-of-a-kind items, the purchase price will be presumed to be the fair market value. Consult your own tax advisor as to the charitable deduction that may be allowed for any item you purchase. Community Reach of Montgomery County is recognized as a Section 501(c)(3) organization by the Internal Revenue Service. As a subsidiary of Reach, MKHC donations fall under the Reach IRS recognition.
- 5. All sales are final. Arrangements for services must be negotiated between the purchaser and the donor.
- 6. Payment may be made by credit card or personal check. Items won can be collected at the end of the event. Payment can be made online at www. cmrocks.org. Use the "Donate" button and add note for Auction payment or use the link in the email sent after the Gala. Please make payment no later than November 15, 2023. Contact Reach at 301-637-0730 with questions or to arrange item pick-up.
- 7. The buyer waives any claims for liability against either Reach or the donor of the property or service. Neither Reach nor the donor is responsible for any personal injuries or damages to property that may result from the use of the property or service sold, and make no representations regarding the quality, safety, condition or any other characteristics of the property or services.

### SILENT AUCTION

- 1. Each silent auction offering will be represented by a bid card showing the item number, catalog title, and a brief description, minimum opening bid, and minimum raise. A bid is entered by placing your bid number on the next available line on the bid card.
- The Gala Committee reserves the right to lower minimum bids, to modify closing times, and to withdraw any item from sale prior to bidding.
- 3. An opening bid must meet or exceed the minimum opening bid shown on the bid card. Each subsequent bid must exceed the previous bid by at least the next amount shown on the bid cards. Bids not meeting these requirements will be disqualified.
- 4. The highest bid on the bid card for each item at the closing constitutes the winning bid. A bid may be disqualified if blocking of bid card occurs. If a bid is illegible in the view of the Auction Committee, the next highest bid will be the winning bid.
- 5. In the event of a dispute, a Reach Official shall act as the final authority and shall determine the winning bidder. The Official's decision shall be final.
- 6. Winners will be informed only after all items are processed. Processing is expected to be completed within 90 minutes of the close of the auction and winning bidders will have invoices delivered to their tables when processing is complete.
- 7. Items will not be available for pick-up until after all auction bids have been processed. If a winner is unable to wait for processing, arrangements can be made to pick up items at the Reach office the following Monday.
