LOP Director Cecilia Rojas Selected for Maryland TESOL Lifetime Achievement Award



We are thrilled to announce that Cecilia Rojas, longtime director of the Language Outreach Program, has been awarded the Maryland TESOL Lifetime Achievement Award in honor of her lifetime of dedication to English language learners and their families. The Lifetime Achievement Award is granted to those who have been working in the TESOL field in Maryland for at least 15 years and have made "substantial and exemplary contributions" to the field.

Thank you to MCAEL for nominating Cecilia for this prestigious award. In her speech at the awards ceremony on November 10th, Cecilia expressed that "it has been a privilege to work with so many dedicated teachers, volunteers, and supporters who have made this journey possible."

New Executive Director Sarah Basehart to Join Reach Team in January 2024

It is with great pleasure that the Board of Directors announces the selection of Sarah Basehart as the new Executive Director of Reach and the Mansfield Kaseman Health Clinic, effective January 1, 2024.

Sarah brings over 25 years of experience in nonprofit work serving people with disabilities and other marginalized communities. She is a skilled advocate with an extensive grassroots advocacy background gained during her tenure at The Arc of Maryland, an organization that supports families and people with disabilities to speak up and create needed change. For the past 13 years, Sarah served as Executive Director of Independence Now, a resource and advocacy center that promotes independent living and equal access for people of all ages with all types of



disabilities living in Montgomery and Prince George's Counties. Leading Independence Now gave Sarah the opportunity to launch new programs, work on housing advocacy at the state and local level as well as continue valuable work in moving people from nursing facilities back to the community. An experienced nonprofit manager, Sarah holds a master's degree in public policy from the University of Maryland Baltimore County.

LOP Student Celebrates Milestone

D first connected with LOP in Fall of 2022. He was very eager to learn and especially to improve his speaking skills. He often relied on his daughter to translate for him when he needed to use English and wanted to be able to speak for himself. He enrolled both in intermediate ESL and conversation classes to improve as quickly as possible.

Over the last year, D has progressed to the Advanced level. During a recent check-in with LOP staff, D related that he'd hit a significant milestone. He shared that, for the first time, he successfully handled a stressful situation in English without assistance from his daughter to translate. On the way back from running an errand, he got in a minor collision with another car. D was able to contact his insurance company on his own and give the details of the incident in English. He was also able to confirm the details of a loaner car with a car rental company.

LOP is an invaluable resource for students who want to feel more connected and integrated into their communities. We're very proud of our students and every milestone they hit on the road to mastering English.
