# COMMUNITY REACH OF MONTGOMERY COUNTY

Dear Friends,

During this fiscal year, with the pandemic and other challenges clearly in our rearview mirror, Reach boldly entered a new phase of growth. Under new leadership, we launched an unprecedented relocation campaign that funded the Mansfield Kaseman Health Clinic's move from downtown Rockville to the Fallsgrove area of the city. We welcomed new board and committee members, recruited new supporters, and connected with new partners. In addition, we streamlined our internal policies and procedures and took a more collaborative approach to budgeting. All these steps helped lay the foundation for our organization's bright future. We invite you to read about how we continue to strengthen our community by uplifting individuals and families who have been historically marginalized. Below are a few highlights.

- **Mansfield Kaseman Health Clinic:** MKHC relocated to a newer, larger facility in the Key West Corporate Center near Adventist HealthCare Shady Grove Medical Center and other medical providers and continued to provide high-quality, culturally appropriate healthcare to 1,205 uninsured/underinsured patients, accommodating 5,068 patient visits. Key services included primary care, specialty care health education, behavioral health visits and screenings, patient navigation, and laboratory and pharmacy services.
- **Housing Program:** A Jefferson House resident developed his computer skills, enhancing his ability to communicate with family via email and handle other online tasks. Meanwhile, a Rockland House resident continued her journey of healing, growth, and self-sufficiency.
- **Language Outreach Program:** LOP provided English as a Second Language (ESL) classes, conversation instruction, and citizenship test preparation for 295 adult students and tutoring to 40 school-aged children. Seventy-one percent (71%) of students improved their English language skills (per course evaluations).
- **Senior Reach Program:** Senior Reach continued to provide home care, home repair/maintenance, case management, and other services, allowing 70 low-income seniors to comfortably age in place. Senior Reach also continued to provide social activities for its clients, offering them opportunities to interact with other seniors and individuals from other generations and helping them build a sense of community.
- **Rockville Emergency Assistance Program:** REAP provided financial emergency assistance that allowed 204 residents to avoid impending evictions and/or foreclosures and maintain their utility services; provided food, clothing, and dental/vision referrals; and assisted clients in applying for Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits and other needed support.
- **Holiday Giving Project:** Reach distributed 446 holiday meals to families and toys and gift cards to over 350 children during the Thanksgiving and December holidays as a Holiday Giving Project partner.

For almost 60 years, Reach has passionately worked toward improving the overall well-being of our community. If you are a supporter, we thank you for believing and investing in us and our cause. We could not do this important work without you. If you are not already a supporter, we invite you to learn more about us and join us in the coming year as we continue to "Reach Beyond."

# Rockville Emergency Assistance Program (REAP)

Financial Assistance and Referrals for Social Programs  
Established 1981

**Total Financial Assistance: \$134,034.00**

In FY24, calls to REAP increased as two other organizations that provide emergency assistance closed, and the Montgomery County Department of Health and Human Services changed its requirements to receive financial assistance. REAP helped direct clients who were ineligible for our funding to other resources throughout the county. Referral numbers grew compared to FY23, with more people facing food insecurity.

Due to a disability, Ms. V could not work and, therefore, could not maintain her mortgage payments. A senior living alone without any family in Maryland, she was afraid that she would soon become homeless. In addition to the financial impact of foreclosure, which would affect her credit score for seven (7) years, Ms. V faced the possibility of losing a lifetime of possessions and treasured mementos. Racing against the clock to prevent foreclosure on her home, Ms. V contacted REAP after having been referred by one of our partner organizations. To resolve the immediate crisis, REAP helped her pay the past due mortgage bills and then connected her to a mortgage counseling agency in the county for advice. REAP also helped her access other county services to which she was eligible. Altogether, the support REAP provided Ms. V enabled her to keep her home, and she was very grateful to have a helping hand during this difficult period.

Ms. G, an octogenarian and resident of the Lincoln Park neighborhood, lives in the same house where she raised her children. She has been a Senior Reach client for over a decade, receiving home care and other services. During a routine check-in with the Senior Reach program director, she mentioned that her water bills had been unusually high lately and that she suspected there was a leak in the water heater. Upon learning this, the program director arranged for a plumber to inspect the water heater, and he confirmed the leak, warning that if left untreated, the heater might explode and flood the property. Senior Reach paid for a replacement water heater and oversaw its installation. As a bonus, Ms. G received a refund from the utility company for some of the water bills thanks to a letter from the plumber informing the company about the leak. Ms. G was extremely grateful for the help, saying that "[t]he emergency device service, home care help and of course the water heater have helped me so much and improved my quality of life greatly!"

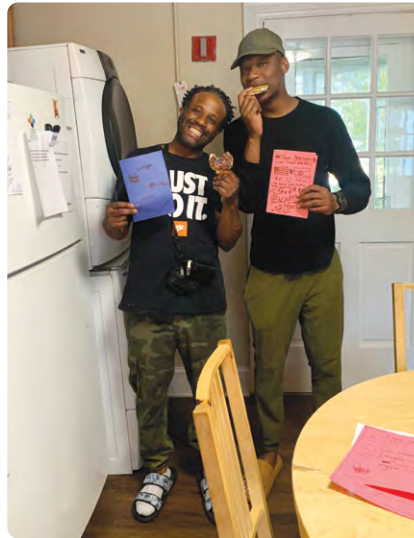

Having faced homelessness, domestic violence, and other life trauma, Ms. W is now on a courageous path toward continued healing, self-care, and self-sufficiency. As a determined survivor, she works toward regaining her independence through housing stability with the support of Reach's Housing Program. A key part of her growth has been learning to engage positively with her housemates, to stretch her social boundaries in a supportive environment, and to connect to a support network. Ms. W has also embraced the value of taking care of herself, including prioritizing her health.

In addition, she has found purpose and fulfillment in giving back to others. Through her volunteer work with Capital Quilts, Ms. W has crocheted 14 baby blankets and contributed to their Comfort Cases project, helping children who are in the adoption process have a dignified way to pack their belongings. She also produces motivational and supportive reels on a popular social media site with over 5,000 followers. Her story is one of strength, perseverance, and transformation and highlights the importance of community support.

# Language Outreach Program (LOP)

**English as a Second Language, Citizenship, and Conversation Classes**  
Established 1993

In FY24, LOP celebrated two major milestones: the program celebrated its 30-year anniversary, and LOP Director Cecilia Rojas won the Maryland TESOL Lifetime Achievement Award, honored for her lifetime of dedication to English language learners and their families. The Lifetime Achievement Award is granted to those who have been working in the TESOL field in Maryland for at least 15 years and have made “substantial and exemplary contributions” to the field. She was also awarded a proclamation by the Montgomery County Council in recognition of her contributions.

The goal of LOP communication classes is to enable students to fully participate in their community by clearly understanding and speaking with employers, medical providers, their children’s teachers, and their neighbors. Strong English skills provide better employment opportunities and a path to financial independence.

In FY24, 71% of ESL students showed an improvement on the post-instruction evaluations and 71% graduated to the next course level. It takes the average adult learner seven years to become proficient in English.

Mr. D first connected with LOP in fall 2022. At the time, he was very eager to improve his English-speaking skills so he would not have to rely on his daughter to translate for him. To improve as quickly as possible, he enrolled in both intermediate ESL and conversation classes.

Over the last year, Mr. D has progressed to the advanced level. During a check-in with LOP staff, Mr. D relayed that he had achieved a significant milestone by independently communicating in English during a stressful situation. While running an errand, Mr. D had a minor car accident. Fortunately, he was able to use his new skills to successfully provide the details of the accident to his insurance company and to reserve a loaner car with a car rental company.

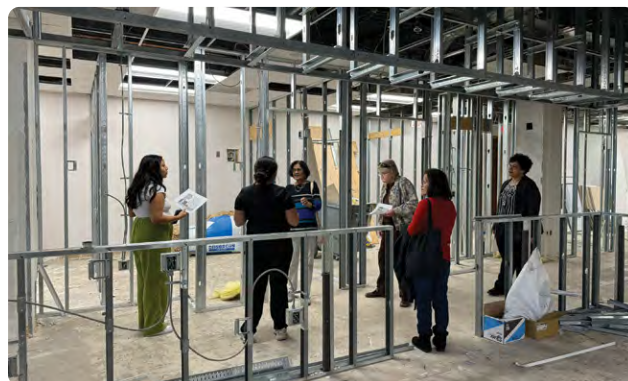




# Mansfield Kaseman Health Clinic

Established 2009

In spring 2024, MKHC relocated to a newer, larger facility in the Key West Corporate Center near Adventist HealthCare Shady Grove Medical Center. The move was the culmination of months of work by staff and board members, who reviewed prospective sites, arranged for renovations, and oversaw the move to the new space. Our new space boasts twice as many exam rooms as the old facility, with abundant natural light and vibrant colors, creating a more sustainable and uplifting atmosphere for patients and staff members alike. On April 17th, we held a ribbon-cutting and dedication ceremony where supporters, local elected officials, board members, and staff toured the new space and celebrated this achievement together.

After a fall, Mr. A experienced severe knee pain that left him unable to sleep at times. Despite the pain, his main concern was being unable to work and provide for his family. Originally from Honduras, Mr. A did not have health insurance to help pay for treatment. He came to MKHC in a wheelchair, where his provider referred him for an MRI and X-ray to find the source of the issue. Working with MKHC's patient navigator, Mr. A received help with scheduling these appointments and completing the necessary paperwork.

Through MKHC's participation in Project Access, a specialty care referral network administered by the Primary Care Coalition, Mr. A attended a consultation with an orthopedic specialist who determined that he would need knee surgery to fix a torn ACL. Mr. A returned to MKHC for all his pre-surgical care, including bloodwork and cardiac clearance, and then underwent the procedure. A month later, he was overjoyed to be back on his feet and able to resume work.
